The Redhawk Academic Mentoring Program (RAMP) seeks to engage Garfield High School students and families in a way that allows them to see themselves as vital parts of the school and larger community. The program aims to support students to feel ownership of their education, which will lead to increased academic performance. RAMP core values at Garfield include...

COMPONENTS OF RAMP:

Mentoring Mon-Thur 8:45-3:35pm	During Advisory and non-academic/elective class periods, students are called to work with their Seattle University mentor once a week. Mentors and students build relationships, set goals, and work to support their social emotional academic development.
Tutoring Tue & Thur 3:45-5pm Sat 9a-12p	Drop-in Tutoring and after school study sessions strengthen social emotional academic development in large and small group settings. We focus on homework completion, developing good study habits, and strengthening organizational skills. Seattle University tutors work with Y-Scholars, Upward Bound, and teachers who need assistance in the classroom. <u>BEGINS TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 19th IN THE LIBRARY</u>
Classroom Supports Mon-Thur 8:45-3:35pm	Individual classroom support is a way for Seattle University mentors/tutors to take part in the social emotional academic growth of students in classroom settings. University students are placed in a classroom to assist teachers by working with small groups as an overall contributions to the learning environment.
