<u>To Do List</u>

- Letter of Recommendation Think about and identify which 2 teachers you will ask
- School List refine college list to 6-10 schools (safety, fit, and reach schools)
- Set up Common App, Coalition (or others) to start application process
- Complete & update your resume or activity list (extra-curriculars, jobs, internships, etc)

• Financial Aid–FAFSA applications will be open around December 2023, be prepared! Talk to your parents about paying for college.

Common App

• Common App is the most frequently used college application website. You can apply for many colleges using Common App. Here are the steps needed to request your counselor report:

• You must enter your assigned counselors email address in the "Counselor Report" section (it may be titled differently)

• Your counselor will then upload your initial transcript, letter of rec, academic evaluation, extracurricular info, and personal characteristics evaluation.

• Your counselor will also upload your initial transcript (start of the year), mid year (after 1st sem grades) and final transcript (end of year in early July)

• Please make sure to enter your Counselors email at least 2 weeks PRIOR to your first deadline – remember, different schools have different deadlines!

Other College App websites

• There are other college app websites (Coalition, SendEdu, Univ. of California, etc.)

• Please make sure to follow their respective instructions carefully

*If your school is not on Common App, please request your transcript via Naviance

*** A **Letter of Recommendation Request Form** is required 2 weeks prior to your first deadline if you are applying to college via Common App, Coalition, SendEdu, or if you are requesting a letter of recommendation from your counselor. The form is found on the School Counseling website under the "Forms" tab

Official Transcripts

• Most colleges accept their transcripts electronically. If you apply via Common App, Counselors will upload your transcripts there once you enter your Counselor's email address into the "Counselor Report" section.

• If your college is not Common App (i.e. Coalition, SendEdu, etc.) please follow their instructions on requesting transcripts.

• You can also use Naviance to request transcripts for most non-Common App college applications (see below for directions)
